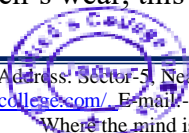

The effects produced using these techniques are incomparable to any techniques and replication of Design is very difficult. The uniqueness of Design creation and the quality of products depends on individual creativity and technique of dyeing. In the present fast fashion world, where young clients are looking for unique products specifically for women's wear, this technique can be exploited.

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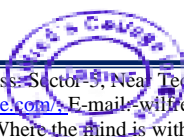
This technique is very much used for customized products rather than mass production. The effect of tie and dye can be enhanced by combining different techniques followed across the globe.”
